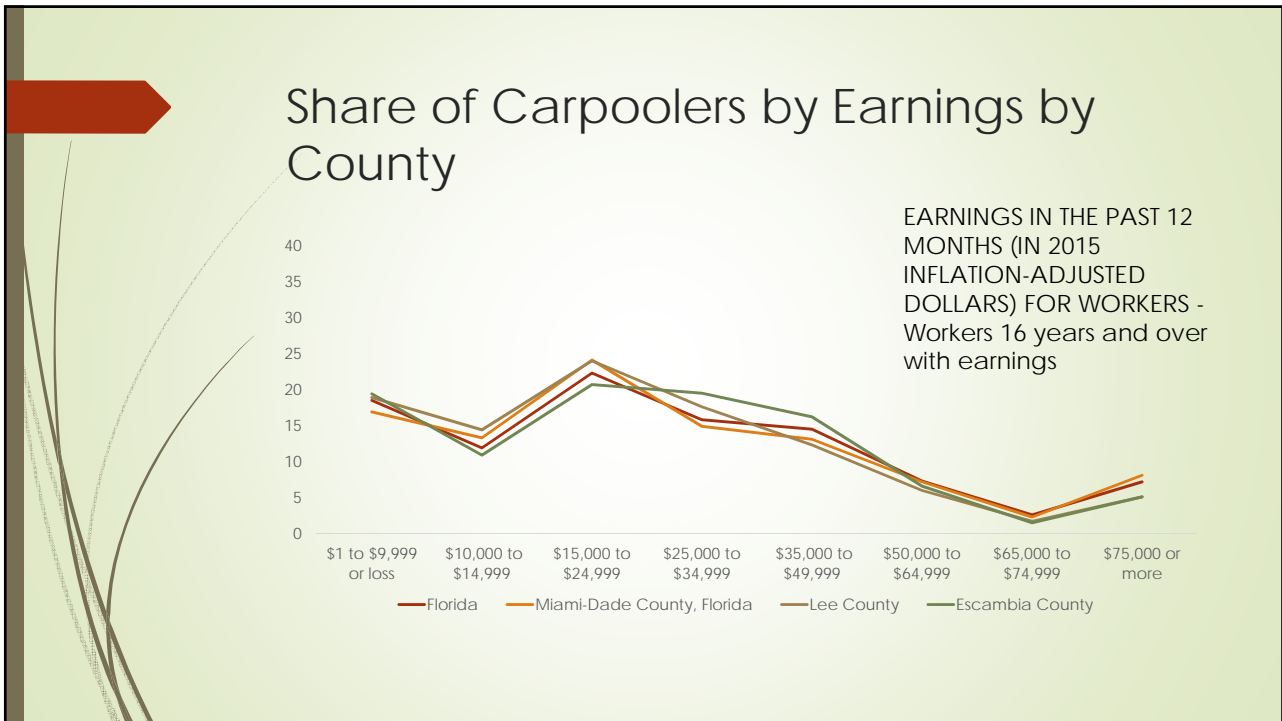
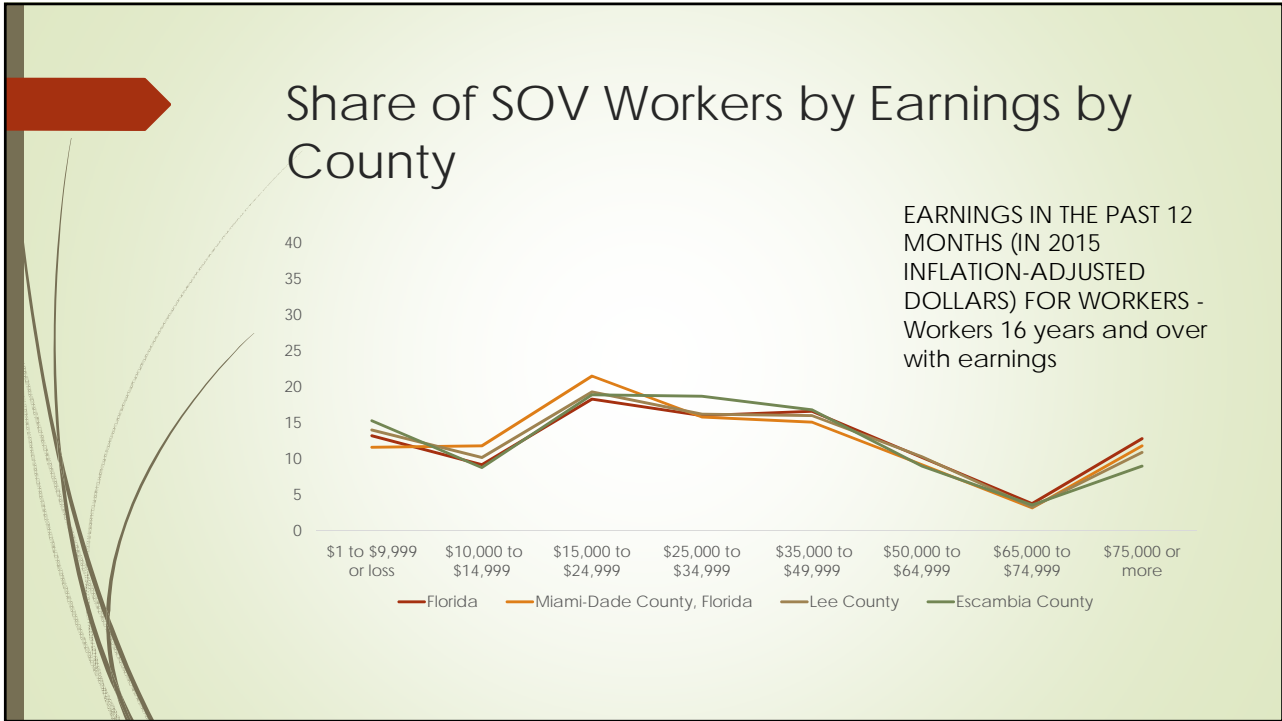


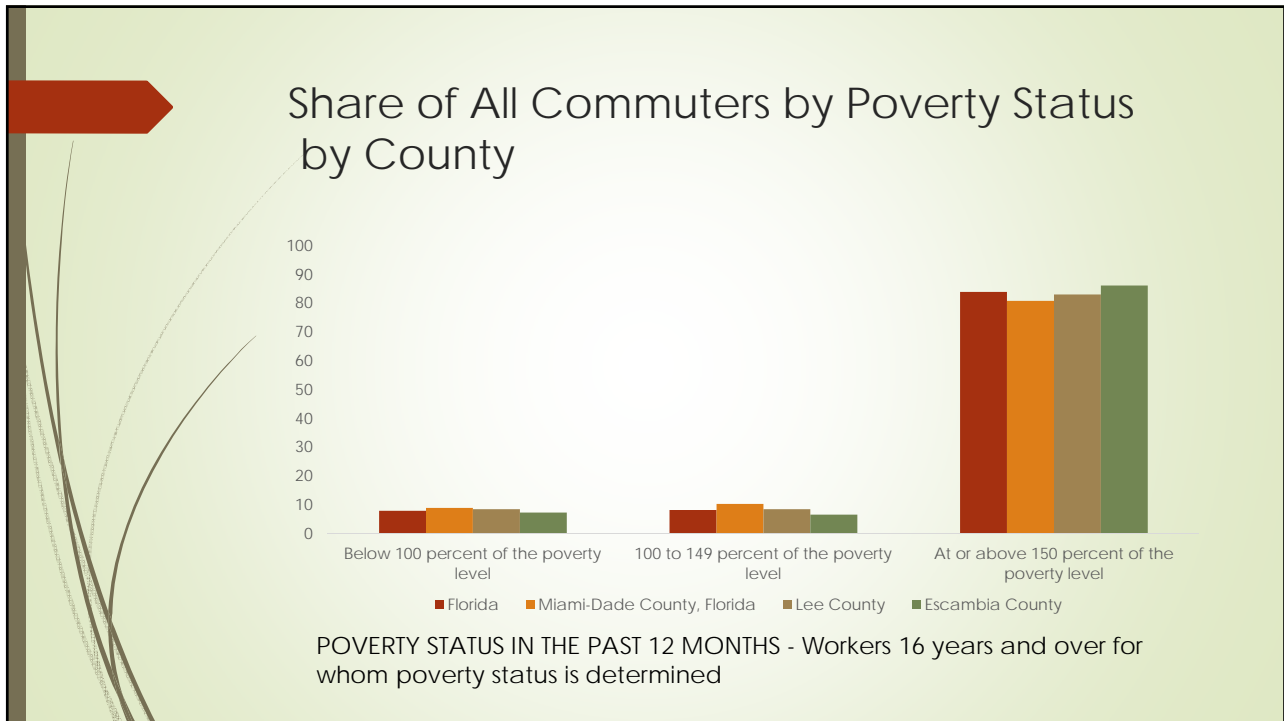
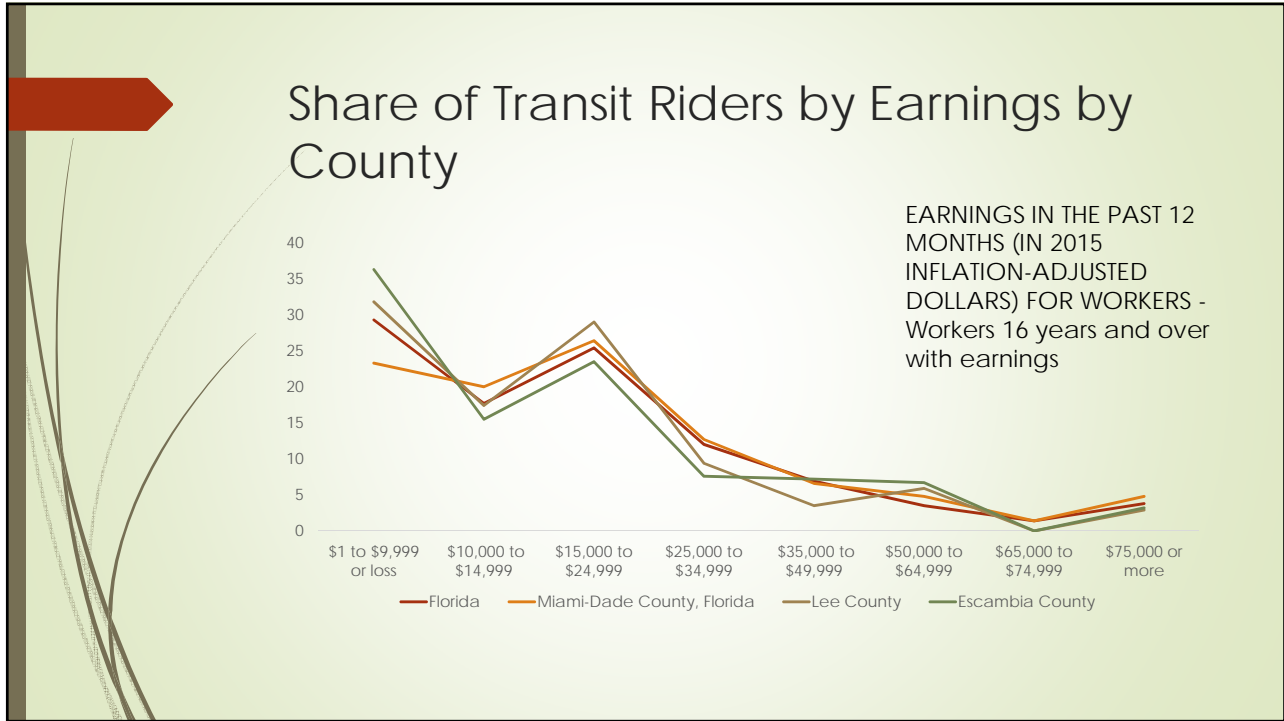


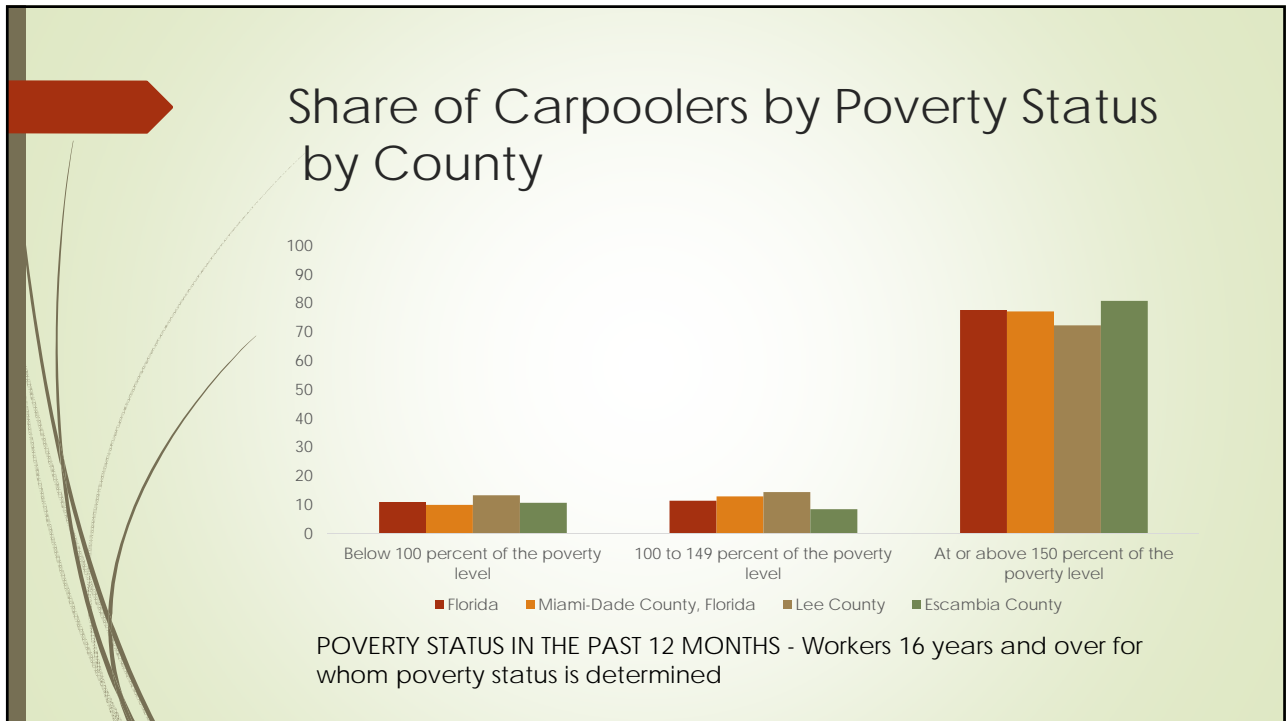
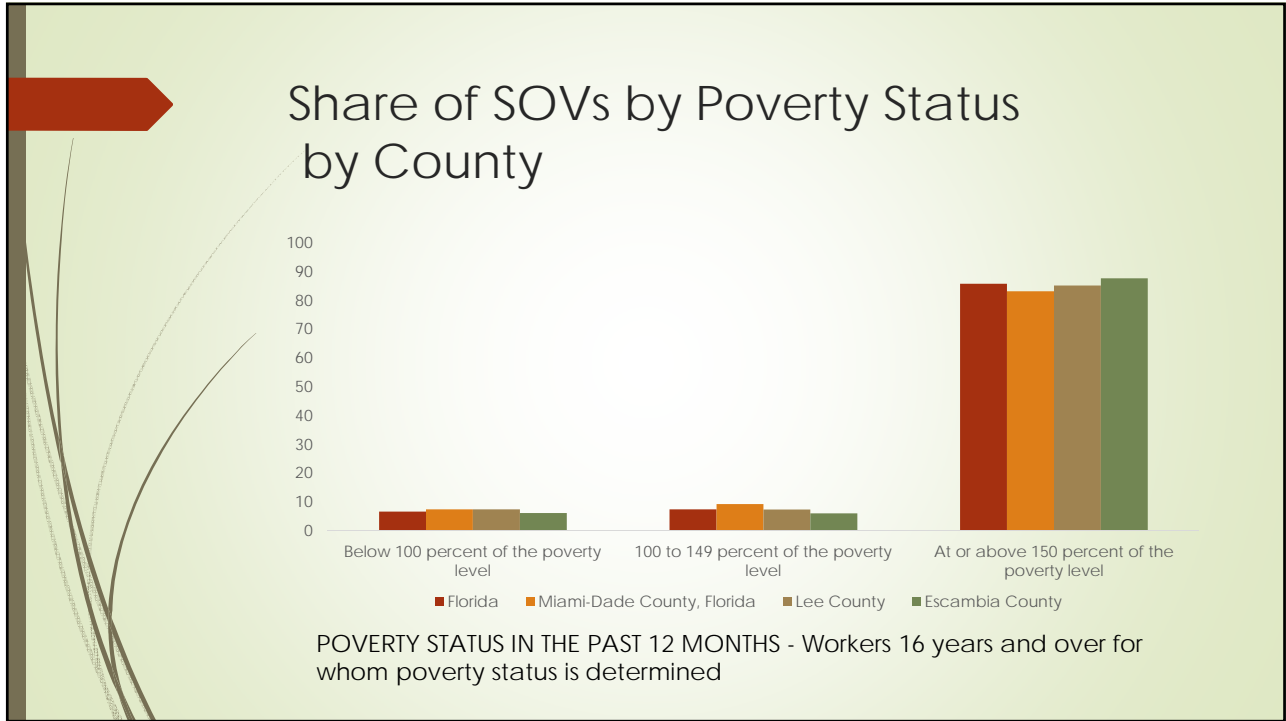


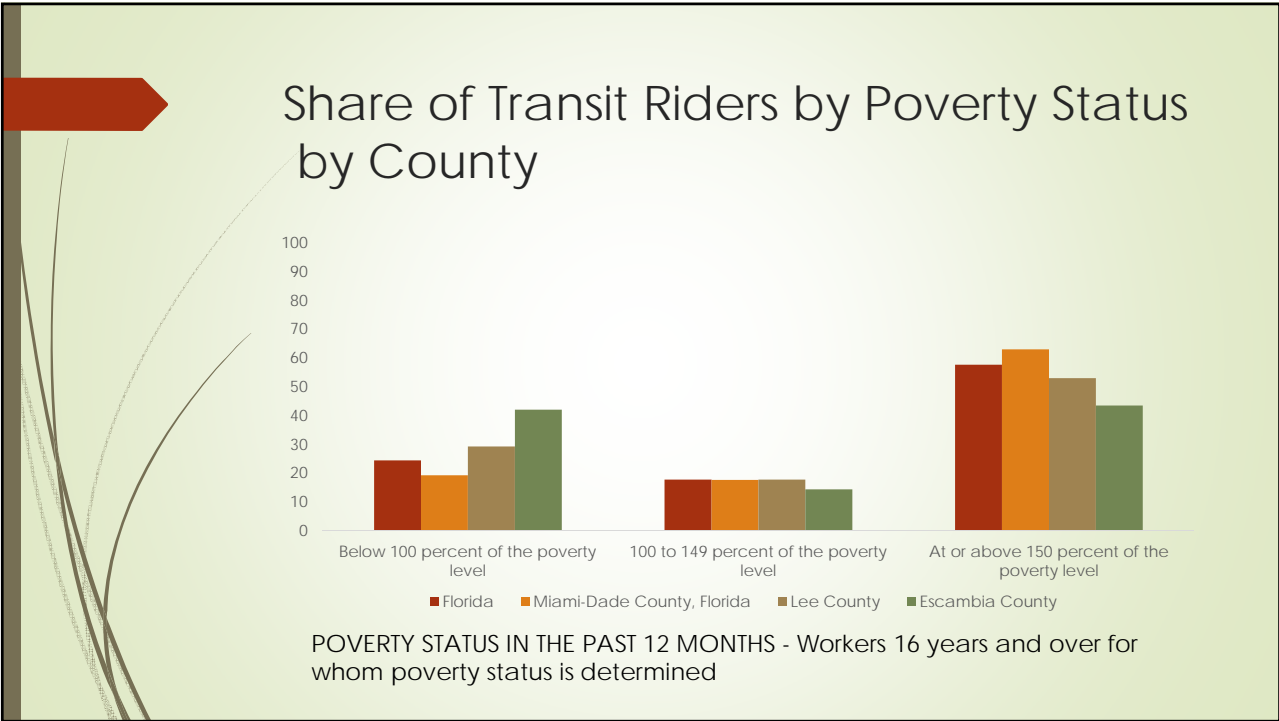
Earnings and Poverty Distributions By Mode



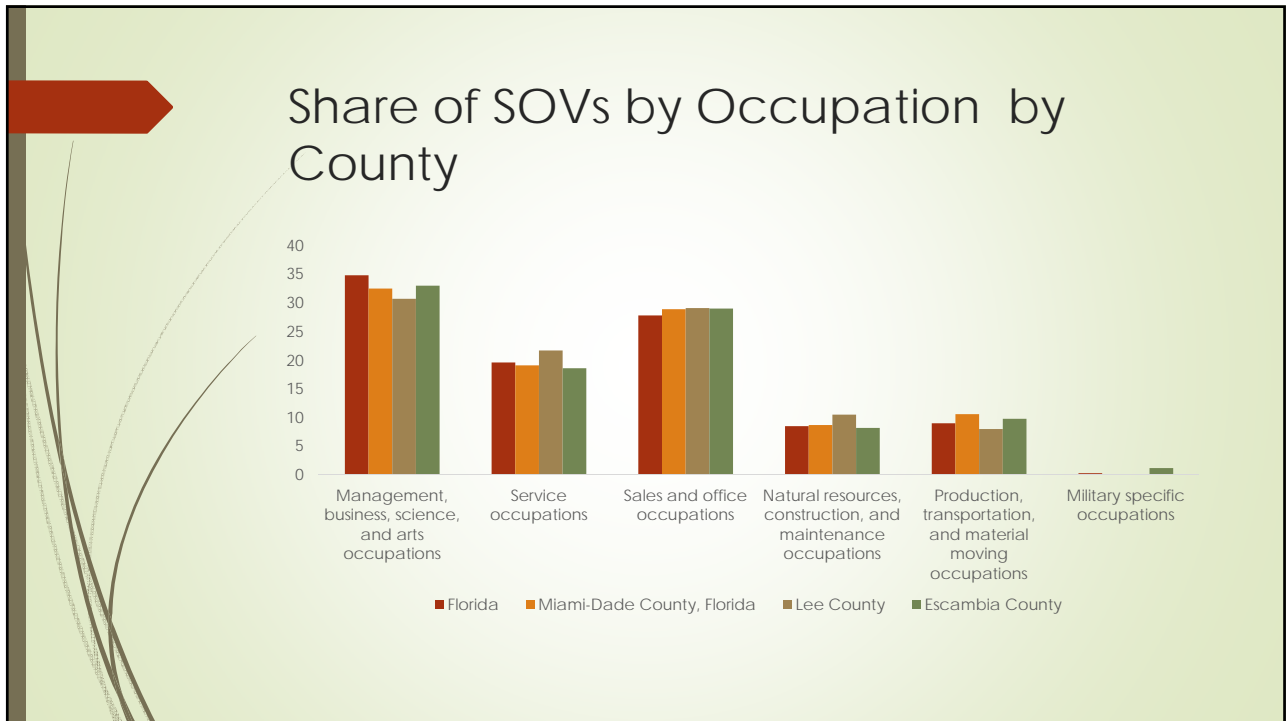
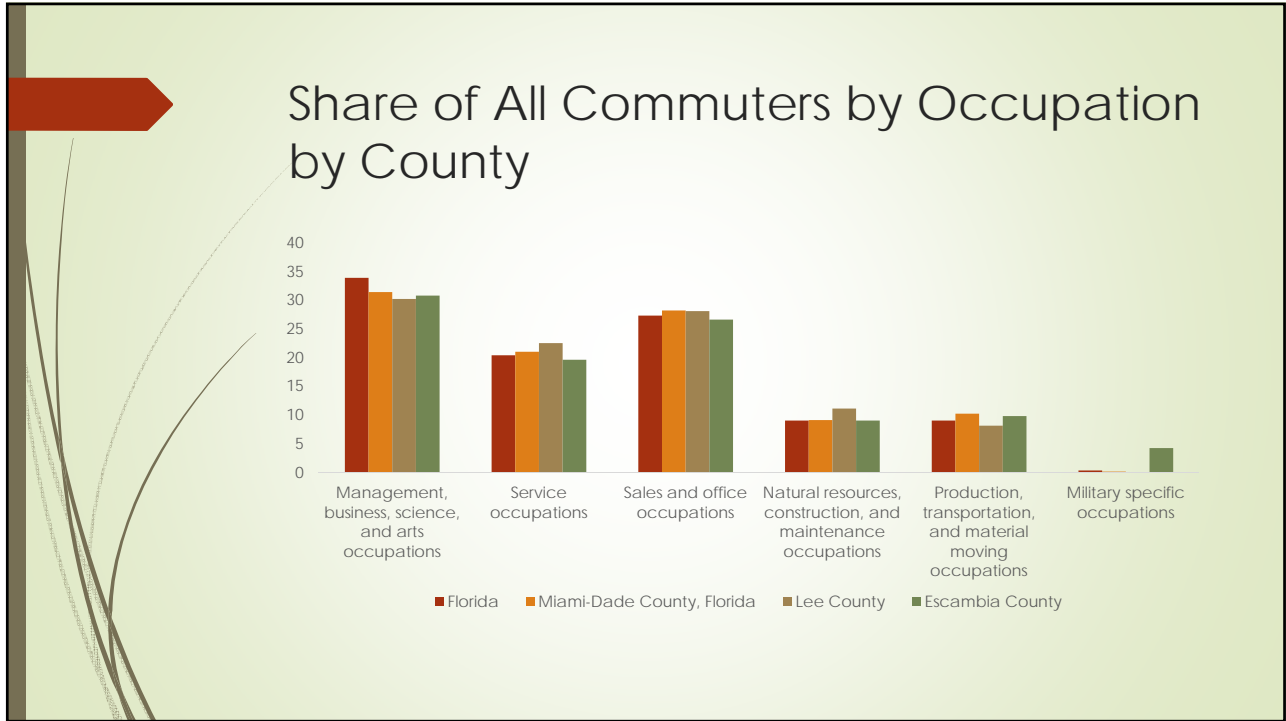


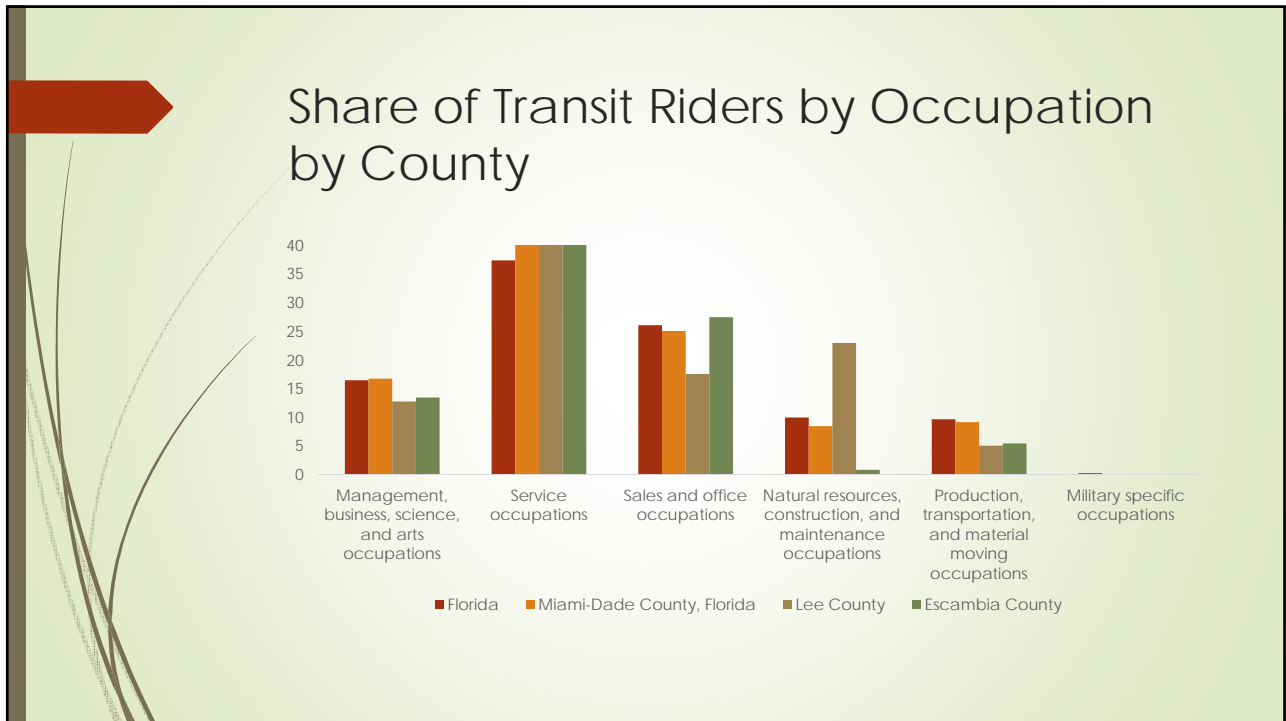
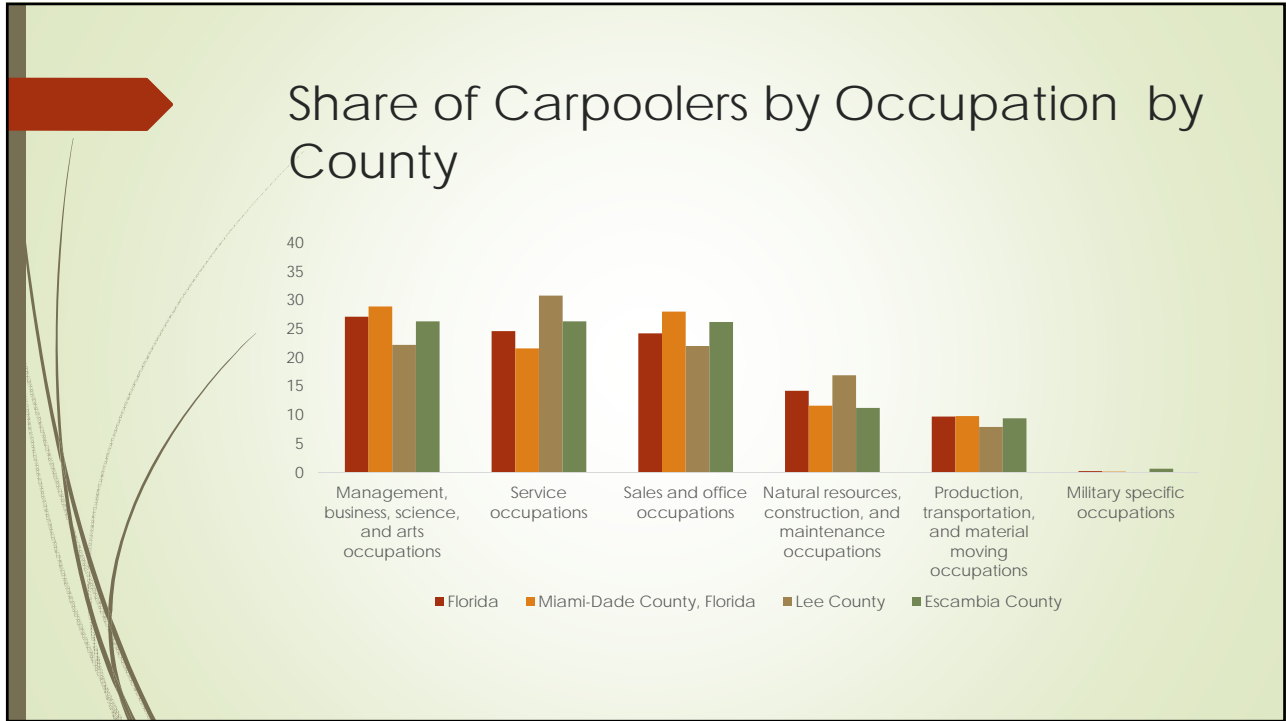




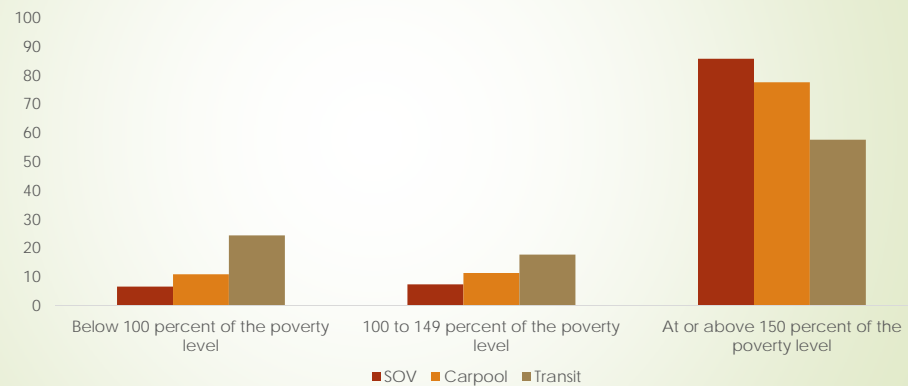


Occupations by Mode



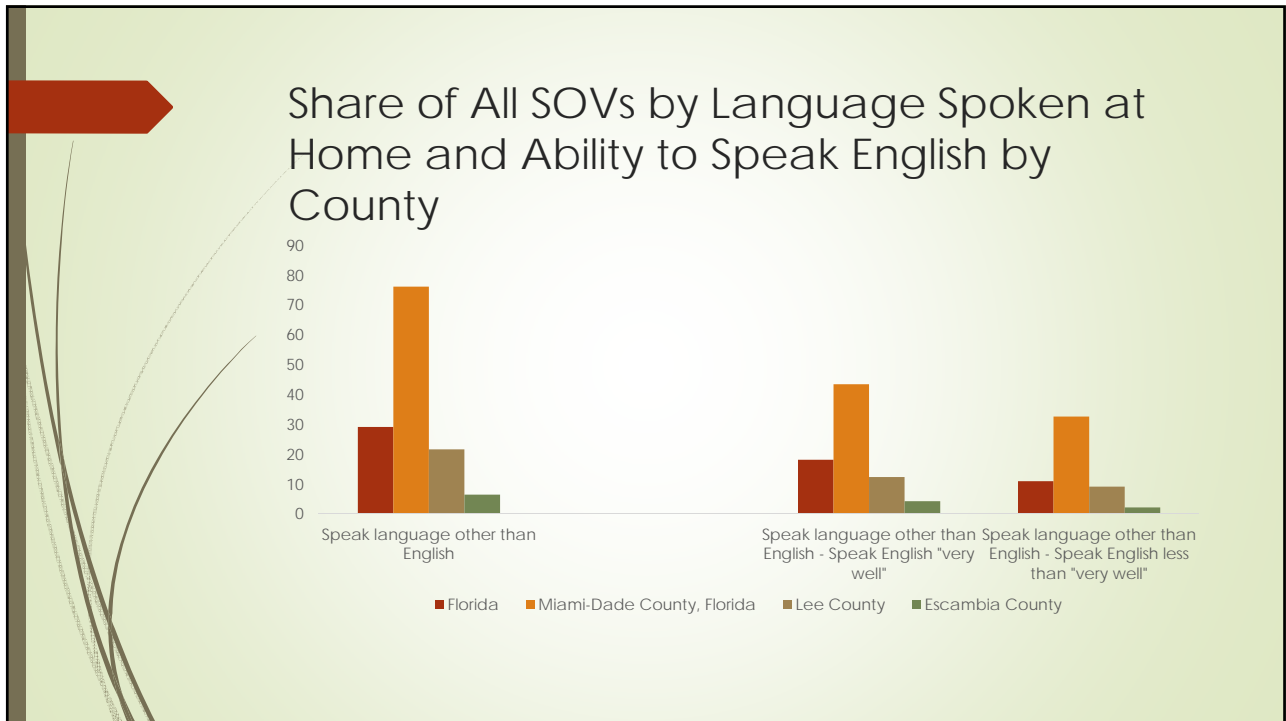
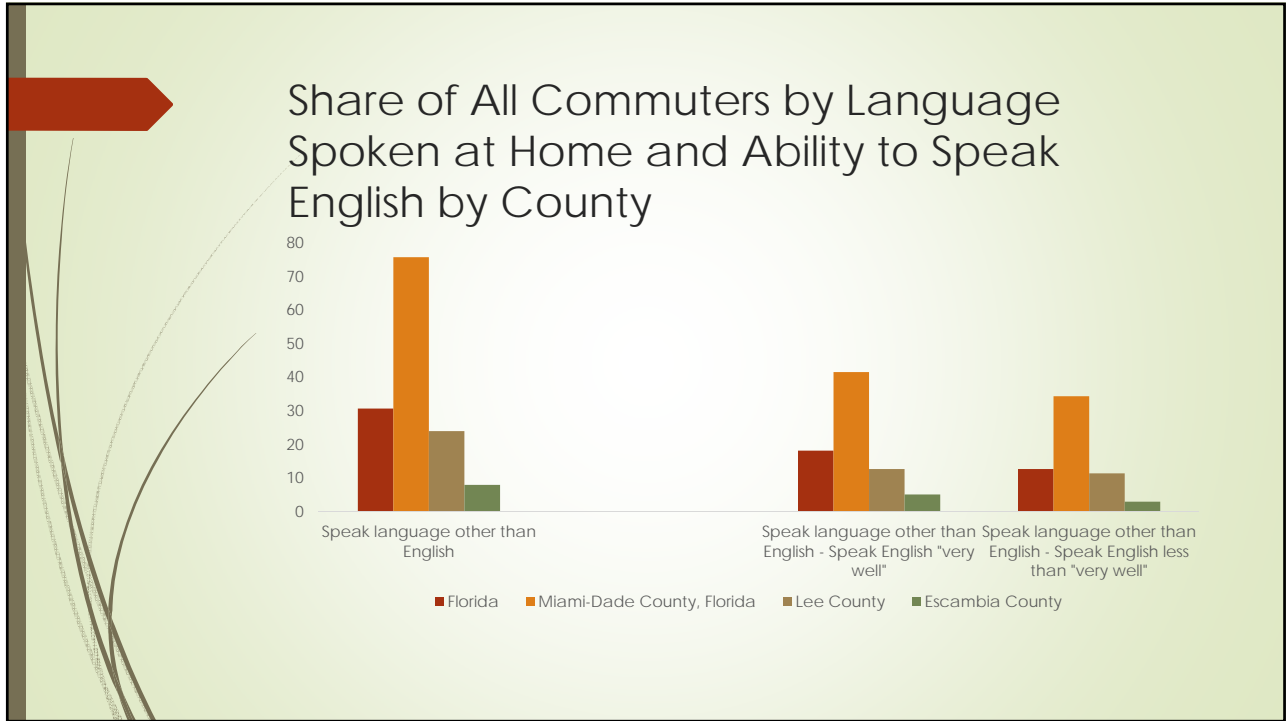


Mode Share by Poverty Status for Florida

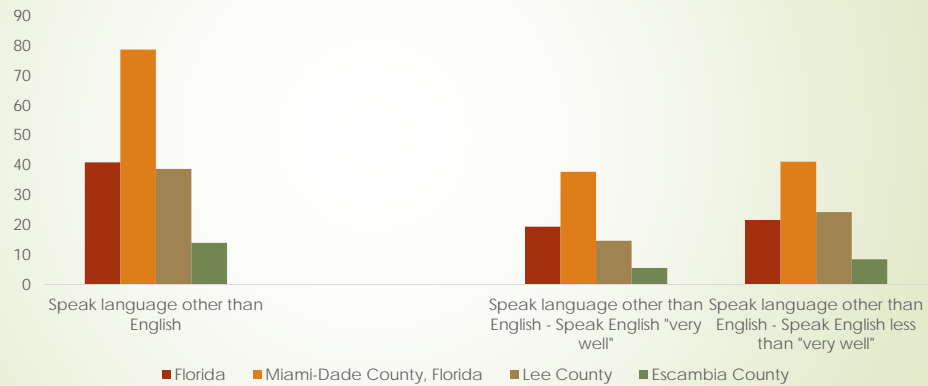


POVERTY STATUS IN THE PAST 12 MONTHS - Workers 16 years and over for whom poverty status is determined
